



## **Precinct Committeemen Primary Election Information**

### **How / When to File**

Those wishing to file to run for precinct committeemen – in their precinct – may submit their CAN-37 form to their county clerk between January 8, 2020 and February 7, 2020 by noon. The CAN-37 form can be obtained either from the county clerk, county chairman, or from the Indiana Election Division website.

### **Precinct Committeeman Qualifications**

IRSC Rule 3-3. No person shall be eligible for election for the office of precinct committeeman or the appointment to the office of Precinct Committeeman or Vice-Precinct Committeeman unless the individual:

(1) is a Qualified Elector of the precinct (if elected) or a Qualified Elector of the county (if appointed); and

(2) is a Qualified Primary Republican; or

(3) he/she obtains an authorization form signed by the County Chairman and the candidate for committeeman saying the individual pledges full support to the Republican Party and the candidates of the Republican Party. This form (IRSC/CA-1) shall be attached to the back of the CAN-37 when the candidate Files his/her declaration with the county clerk, or county election board as appropriate for the county. The County Chairman shall also Communicate a copy of this form to the State Secretary.

### **Precinct Committeeman Values & Duties**

Register new voters

Turn out the Republican vote on Election Day

Recruit and train volunteers

Be the local advocate for the Republican Party

Fill your precinct election boards

Update and correct the voter name list

Be involved in the local party's activities (i.e. electing the leadership of your local party)
